At the same time, Le Grange's Bill is far more serious than the declaration of a state of emergency last year for a limited time and limited areas. Le Grange's Bill is tantamount to a permanent State of Emergency which applies to any area which opposes the regime at any point.

The threat of unrest, let alone actual unrest, is enough for Le Grang to justify using these powers. Le Grange's Bill will entrench the concentration of powers to the the hands of the SAP and in particular the SADF. As such, it brings South Africa one step closer to martial law.
