'OUR REQUEST IS THAT THE ECCI IMMEDIATELY INTERVENE IN THE SITUATION OBTAINING IN THE CPSA IN WHATEVER MANNER THE ECCI THINKS BEST. IT SEEMS TO US THAT ONLY THE AUTHORITY OF THE ECCI COULD SAVE THE UTTER DISINTEGRATION OF THE CPSA. YOU WILL UNDERSTAND THAT THIS IS MOST UNCALLED FOR, IT IS INDESCRIBABLY CRIMINAL IN THIS PRESENT WORLD POLITICAL SITUATION. 1

WE SHALL BE VERY GLAD IF OUR REQUEST WOULD BE IMMEDIATELY GRANTED. 2
